I am writing today to support a ban of Indian mascots in schools that receive State funding. Causa is Oregon's statewide immigrant rights organization, and many of our members are indigenous peoples from Mexico and Central America. As an organization that is supportive of Indian People, the preservation of the rights they reserved through treaties, their civil rights, human rights and rights as citizens of the United States I am asking that you also respect these rights and end the used of Indian Mascots.


Research has shown that the continued use of American Indian mascots, names, symbols, images, and personalities has a negative effect on not only American Indians students but all students.

The use of Indian Mascots undermines the educational experiences of members of all communities-especially those who have had little or no contact with Indigenous peoples. The symbols, images and mascots teach non-Indian children that it's acceptable to participate in culturally abusive behavior and perpetuate inaccurate misconceptions about American Indian culture.

The use of Indian Mascots establishes an unwelcome and often times hostile learning environment for American Indian students that affirms negative images/stereotypes that are promoted in mainstream society. This kind of objectification is damaging to all minority students.

Please protect Oregon students and provide socially and psychologically safe learning environments for all students free of objectification and damaging stereotypes.
