**WHY!!!!** Why did some tribes reject the IRA?

Sample Answer: After years of corrupt dealings with the federal government some tribes felt the IRA was an act of assimilation. These tribes felt that to operate under a constitution and system of checks and balances modeled after the US' would irreparably change the way their people thought and felt about tribal leadership; these tribes instead chose to continue to operate under a government modeled after their traditional form of government.
